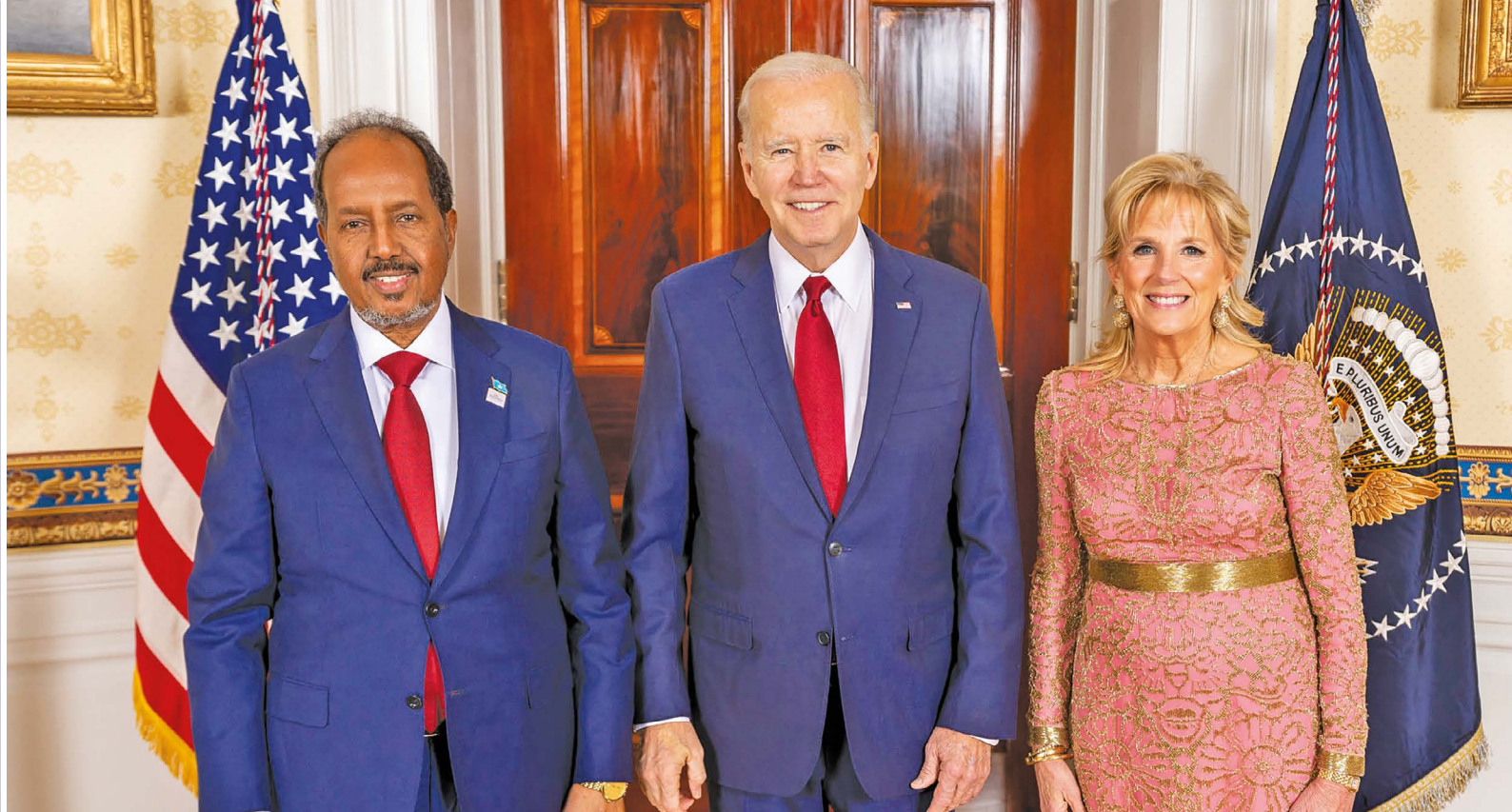




America, Somalia's Dependable Ally
